Pest Alert: Ramorum dieback (Phytophthora ramorum) in trade

- Phytophthora ramorum is a serious fungus-like pathogen that damages a wide range of trees and ornamentals and is a **significant threat** to our woodlands, parks and gardens.
- It is most frequently found on Rhododendron and Viburnum in trade.
- In addition to *Rhododendron* and *Viburnum*, it infects a **wide range of ornamental hosts** including *Camellia, Choisya, Ilex, Lonicera, Magnolia, Osmanthus, Photinia, Pieris, Ribes* and *Vaccinium*.
- Symptoms on ornamental hosts include a **dagger-shaped blackening that extends along the midrib**, stem lesions, leaf wilt and **dieback**.
- Phytophthora ramorum is spread by water (including irrigation systems), aerial dispersal via mist and rain and soil on tools, vehicles and boots. Symptoms are likely to show after periods of heavy rain.
